REFUGEE UPDATE - Salad Ali arrived from Indonesia this past summer. He had been there for 5 years after fleeing Somalia. He had been shot in the leg in Somalia by the local insurgents. He was only 14 at the time. He is enjoying his new life in Saint John! He has just started English classes at the YMCA. He is just learning to cook. In Somalia his mother did the cooking and in Indonesia he bought food sold in the streets. He would like to bring his mother and 2 brothers to Saint John but they are still in Somalia so do not qualify as refugees. Mohamed Dalien is still in Turkey where he fled from Syria. His father, mother and sisters live in Saint John. They have not seen him in 5 years. We are hopeful that he will arrive this fall. We have also welcomed 2 Eritrean men who had fled to Israel. They are Coptic Catholics and I am hoping to bring them to mass some Sunday. They have both registered at the YMCA and will attend English classes to improve their English. They recently surprised me by giving a man with a homeless sign \$5. The homeless helping the homeless! This is a lesson for all of us. *Jean MacDonald, Refugee Committee, jeanrynlon@gmail.com*
