Lent: What is it about?

Easter is the most important celebration of the church year – Jesus is alive! We use Lent to get ready for His coming. Just as you would clean the house, prepare a bed, and cook meals for guests coming to stay, we prepare for Jesus' coming as well. There are a few traditional practices you can do; a common one is giving up a certain food or drink for Lent (bye-bye chocolate!). Many people also have smaller, simpler meals; give up snacking; or refrain from certain forms of entertainment, like Facebook, TV, or video games. We don't do this to be unhappy

– it actually is intended to do the opposite! Every time we want to have or do something we have given up, it is an opportunity to bring Jesus to the front of our thoughts – a prayer-prompt! However, you can choose to START doing something instead of giving something up – choose to start praying before meals, saying a daily Rosary, praying before bed, reading Scripture daily or some other form of spiritual practice that will help you grow closer to Jesus. Don't go overboard – choose one you can commit to (and don't beat yourself up if you slip – just start again!) By observing these practices, we get ready to celebrate Easter with clean and happy hearts!
